## Introduction

This statement details the available facilities and equipment at Charlton Medical Centre for the treatment of anaphylaxis. Furthermore, it details who is responsible for ensuring the equipment is readily available to treat anaphylactic reactions.

## **Statement**

At Charlton Medical Centre, the following drugs are available for the treatment of anaphylaxis:

 Adrenaline 1:1000 (1mg/1ml) – located on the two Crash Trollies in the Minor Surgery Room and Treatment Room

Additional equipment which may be required is held on the two Crash Trollies in the Minor Surgery Room and Treatment Room. This includes:

- Oxygen and ancillaries
- Defibrillator and ancillaries

All emergency equipment is the responsibility of Emma Colley (Lead) and Angela David (Deputy) who ensure that adequate supplies are held and the equipment is serviceable.

All emergency drugs are the responsibility of Emma Colley (Lead) and Angela Davis (Deputy) who ensures that all items are in-date.
